Kelley Challen, Ed.M., CAS is a nationally recognized transition specialist, consultant, and speaker who has worked with adolescents and young adults with diverse learning and developmental profiles since 2004. She specializes in postsecondary transition planning for students on IEPs, with expertise in autism, executive functioning, self-determination, and college readiness.

From 2013 to 2025, Kelley served as Director of Transition Services at NESCA (Neuropsychology & Education Services for Children & Adolescents), where she led transition assessment, consultation, coaching, and program development for students and families across New England, helping teams translate assessment data into realistic postsecondary plans.

Kelley regularly consults with families, school districts, and professionals; participates in IEP meetings; and provides coaching for young adults exiting special education. She has contributed to state and national transition initiatives and is the author and co-author of multiple publications, including the Planning Beyond the IEP newsletter on Substack.

She holds a Master's degree and Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study from the Harvard Graduate School of Education and is also the parent of two school-aged children.
